The successful applicant will work in a dynamic, international research environment. The position would be an ideal substantive fit for students interested in development, political and economic inequality, and in processing and analyzing large-scale online data. One position is reserved for a candidate that is particularly strong in the field of statistical software development.

#### Your tasks and duties

- Data collection, including automated approaches ("webscraping");
- Data management, analysis, and visualization;
- Collaboration and discussion of research ideas;
- Literature search;

- Testing and conducting the application of Large Language Models (LLM) to social scientific tasks (e.g., text annotation, image recognition, data extraction);
- Development and maintenance of statistical software tools for causal inference and open science applications.

## **Requirements**

- Enrolment in a Bachelor (advanced) or Master program with a focus on political science, economics, data science, statistics, or a related discipline;
- Excellent knowledge of the English language (the working language of the research department is English);
- Good knowledge of German, Arabic, Russian, and/or Chinese is a big plus;
- Training in and experience with statistical methods, advanced regression models, and excellent R, Python and/or Stata skills;
- Optional: Interest and experience in formal modelling (game theory, agent-based modelling);
- Competent handling of MS Office applications.
