Tasks

The candidate will be in charge of developing a novel generation of computing architectures based on ion computing. Development of novel switchable ultracapacitors and microsupercapacitors for iontronic applications, synthesis of porous carbon materials and porous membranes, development and adaption of new electrolyte formulations, electrochemical characterization, impedance spectroscopy, cyclic voltammetry, integration into a team of PhD and master students, scientific publishing, data management.

- experience in the field of electrochemistry in particular ultracapacitors, cyclovoltammetry, impedance spectroscopy
- broad knowledge of materials characterization methods in particular as relevant for porous materials
